

Train Station Garden Volunteer Tasks

These are the typical tasks garden volunteers will complete at the Train Station Garden. Please note that the Garden Chair will offer guidance to volunteers and that the tasks listed below may be amended at her direction.

- Water the plants in the urns with about two gallons each for every day of your duty when the weather is hot. During periods of rain or cool weather, watering may not be needed or less water may be sufficient. Check the soil first.
- Deadhead the garden beds and urn plantings regularly to encourage new flowers. Please remember to bring your gardening gloves. Roses have thorns!
- Pull weeds in the urns and beds. You may want to bring a small trash bag to use for discarded weeds.
- Monitor for fungal blackspot, powdery mildew, and insects. If any noticed, please alert the chair. If anything else seems amiss, e.g. portions of the garden seem especially dry, alert the chair.
- Finally, check with the Train Station Garden Chair to see if there are any changes to the above, including additional tasks to complete or to skip.

Thank you for fulfilling your club responsibility by volunteering for this important duty. Many hands make light work and all members appreciate that you have contributed to making our club's garden spectacular.
